
We, members of the **Rotary Genève International**, would like to invite you to join forces with us to relieve the suffering of thousands of Refugees who have been forced to flee.

UNHCR





The United Nations Refugee Agency is mandated to lead and co-ordinate international action to protect refugees and resolve refugee problems worldwide. Its primary purpose is to safeguard the rights and well-being of refugees. It strives to ensure that everyone can exercise the right to seek asylum and find safe refuge in another State, with the option to return home voluntarily, integrate locally or to resettle in a third country. It also has a mandate to help stateless people.

Since 1950, the Agency has helped tens of millions of people restart their lives. Today, a staff of more than 9,300 people in 123 countries continues to help and protect millions of refugees, returnees, internally displaced and stateless people.

As the Syrian conflict continues, millions of refugees are caught in alarmingly deteriorating conditions, facing an even bleaker future. With no solution to the conflict in sight, most of the 4 million Syrian refugees in Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq and Egypt see no prospect of returning home in the near future, and have little opportunity to restart their lives in exile.

Inside Syria, the situation is deteriorating rapidly. There's great concern about the extremely dire humanitarian situation in Madaya and other besieged areas, and distressing reports of people at risk of starving to death. UNHCR estimates that there may be up to 400,000 vulnerable people including children and the elderly who need help.

What is UNHCR doing to help?

- It provides basic and necessary humanitarian aid for Syrian refugees and helps the most vulnerable refugees with urgently needed relief cash for medicine and food, stoves and fuel for heating, insulation for tents, thermal blankets and winter clothing
- It delivers life-saving assistance on the ground to Madaya, including water, food, medicine, blankets and warm clothes, household items, diapers and hygiene supplies, and jerry cans
- By helping refugees in the surrounding region, UNHCR hopes to reduce the number of desperate Syrians resorting to smugglers and falling prey to traffickers to reach safety elsewhere.

Thanks to the generous support of donors since January alone, 1.8 million refugees received food aid, 500,000 children were enrolled in school, and shelter in camps were provided for more than 460,000 refugees. www.unhcr.org

LIFE BISCUITS





Why is a Life Biscuit needed?

Every day we hear about new natural and complex disasters that result in people facing malnutrition, particularly children. The present picture of starving Syrian refugees confirms this chilling reality.

What can we do?

In 2007, Dr Royston Flude began a quest to address malnutrition resulting from disasters and the consequences of pandemics.

This requires a total food replacement that could be used with water for up to 120 days. Recent research from Cardiff University indicates that having a good breakfast can lift academic attainment in children by 100%.

Our Life Biscuit is perfect for this group as well as the elderly, hospitalised patients and refugees. As its name implies "It give Life".

Who is involved?

The **Consensus for Self-sustaining People, Organisations & Communities (CSPOC)**, which is an ECOSOC accredited not-for-profit NGO, partnered with the **Swiss biscuit manufacturer Kambly**. Kambly have been producing the Survival Biscuit for the Swiss Army since 1959. We are also working with the University of Chester based Northwest Food Research Development Centre (NoWFOOD) with a view to providing an internationally recognised Kite mark of quality and efficacy.

How is the Life Biscuit funded?

The development of the Life biscuit was initially funded by Dr Flude and has now moved to a development consortium.

The prototypes have an amortised cost of CHF 10 packet. Our plan is be able to supply individuals for 1\$ per day (three packets).

We hope to achieve this objective by economies of scale in manufacture and selling a commercial product for weight management where each packet sold funds a packet for a starving child.
