Origin of mine-ex and FSD

Fondation mine-ex

- Origin: ICRC Surgeon Stirnimann
- Started in 1995 as "a project of Swiss Governors"
- "mine-ex Stiftung Rotary District 1980, 1990 and 2000" in 2005
- Aim: Mine Victim Assistance

Fondation Suisse de Déminage (FSD)

- Origin: Several of the founders ex-ICRC (including myself)
- Started in 1997 as an association
- 2003 transformed into a Foundation
- Aim: Mine Action (includes Mine Victim Assistance)

Donor vs. Operational foundation

Mine-ex

- This is a DONOR foundation
- Supports ICRC in Cambodia and Afghanistan with CHF 800K / yr.
- Raises funds through Swiss Rotary network: 1.5 million in 2016, 1.5 million in 2017
- 2017: 20K for FSD "as a one time only donation"

- This is an OPERATIONAL foundation
- Mine Action operations in Tajikistan, Afghanistan, the Philippines, Ukraine, Colombia, Iraq, Chad, CAR
- Raises 10 million / year, mainly from govts. / institutional donors

- Not ZEWO certified
- Not ISO certified

- Publishes detailed accounts as per Swiss GAAP RPC 21
- ZEWO certified
- ISO 9001:2018 certified

Rotary representation

Mine-ex

- Board of Swiss Rotary Governors has one representative on the board
- No matching funds from Rotary International

- 3 Rotarians on FSD board
- No funding from Rotary
